# 5. TREASURER'S REPORT - 2024 ACCOUNTS & 2025 STATUS

**Treasurer Foti Lykiardopulo (FL)** presented the 2024 accounts and the 2025 year-to-date figures.

Key points raised:

- ISMA's financial situation remains healthy.
- The Archive project would benefit from broader voluntary contributions.
- ISMA accounting is migrating fully online; in future this will allow invoices to be issued electronically allowing card payment or bank transfer.
- ISMA will accept payments in multiple currencies including USD, EUR and CAD.

## 6. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

LH informed the assembly that the full Board was up for re-election. All current officers expressed willingness to continue, except **Ossi Paija** (Vice-President Marketing), who is stepping down.

LH expressed appreciation for the Board's strong commitment and effective collaboration.

# 7. REVIEW OF ISMA CHAMPIONSHIP REGATTA VENUES

# 7.1 2026 Europeans — Geneva (SUI)

Presentation by **Mathieu Fischer (MF)** from Société Nautique de Genève (SNG). MF outlined the season's race calendar, logistics, accommodation options and yard facilities around Lake Geneva.

LH added comments on storage options and recommended yards.

# 7.2 2027 Worlds - Helsinki (FIN)

TO confirmed that the 2027 Worlds at NJK (Helsinki) were voted and agreed. Further details will be communicated by **Patrick Sandman** at a later date.

# 7.3 2028 Europeans — Bid from Club Nàutic S'Arenal (ESP)

LH noted the venue is not yet ready for a vote. Further details regarding dates and logistics must be clarified. Voting will take place online once outstanding issues are resolved.

# 7.4 2029 Worlds - Sardinia (ITA)

TO confirmed the event has been voted and agreed.

LH added that dates remain under discussion due to mistral risk and heavy club scheduling in September. June is being considered as a safer option.

# 7.5 2030 Europeans


The year remains open. TO noted that it is unusual to have so many events secured this far ahead, which indicated strong interest from yacht clubs for hosting the class.

Suggestions included La Trinité-sur-Mer (FRA).

Discussion followed regarding criteria for venue selection, raised by **Rainer Müller** (RM).

TO acknowledged the need to document informal criteria alongside the official venue requirements.

# 8. SIX METRE ARCHIVE UPDATE

Presented by Tom Owen (TO).

## Key updates:

- Annual Archive Report circulated to all at the meeting and posted on the Archive website.
- Report will shift to a spring publication schedule to align with the start of the sailing season.
- Significant progress made cataloguing historical materials.
- Social media and website analytics show strong growth, especially among US users.
- The Archive relies on voluntary contributions; TO encouraged financial support from all nations and in particular he noted that there were almost no contributions from the USA despite having the largest group of users
- New Oral History Project launched, with first interviews recorded (Tim Russell
  and Tim Street, with others planned for the near future).

Questions were raised regarding possible integration of the Archive with ISMA, taxadvantaged donation structures, and long-term funding models.

Contributors included Nick Lykiardopulo (NL), Basil Vasiliou (BV) and several others. TO and LH explained current structure and ongoing discussions.

# 9. SUBJECTS FOR DISCUSSION

# 9.1 Insurance Challenges for the Fleet

**BV** presented an extensive summary of recent insurance difficulties faced by owners, particularly regarding:

- · Restrictions from Pantaenius and other insurance companies
- · Registration issues for certain jurisdictions
- Limited coverage for certain regions (e.g., USA & Switzerland)
- · Difficulties insuring wooden boats

# BV recommended:

- 1. Appointing an insurance consultant
- 2. Exploring fleet-wide long-term insurance agreements
- 3. Examining self-insurance options

RM, NL and various other owners contributed to the discussion, touching on:

- Legal frameworks across different countries
- · Risks of insuring the entire fleet
- · Sharing insurance information among owners
- The unique challenges of insuring wooden boats
- The need for professional advice

NL offered to assist given his background in marine mutual insurance.

# 9.2 MARKETING AND COMMUNICATION STRATEGY

LH explained that **Patrick Sandman** (the new Vice-President Marketing) would circulate a written proposal for discussion.

Comments were made regarding:

- Role of national associations in generating local press and communications (LH)
- Opportunities to highlight new boats at events (also several other speakers)
- Need for long-term strategic positioning of the class to attract younger sailors
- Value of emphasising Six Metres as a development class

RM thanked LH and the Board for all their work on behalf of the class.
